Catherine Campbell Harberts AKA Scotty, left us on December 1, 2017 in Napa, California. She was born November 20, 1919 to William and Ethel Campbell in Indianapolis, Indiana.

She married John Calvin Harberts in Los Angeles in 1942. In the early 1950's the Harberts family moved to Honolulu, Hawaii, where they enjoyed island living for almost 10 years. In the early 1960's they moved to Napa, California and purchase the Old Bubbling Well ranch, which is now Bubbling Well Pet Memorial Park. She volunteered for Community Projects at Queen of the Valley Hospital in Napa for 35 years.

She is survived by her children Phillip William Harberts, Candis Harberts Coleman and Dan Campbell Harberts and their spouses; four grandchildren and five great grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her son David Harberts and husband John Calvin Harberts and her granddaughter Karrie McElroy.
