



Charles Francis Conley

January 10, 1937 - May 25, 2014

Charles “Chuck” Francis Conley, 77, of Napa, California, died May 25, 2014. Chuck was born Jan. 10, 1937, in Cleveland, Ohio, to Charles Francis and Mary Edythe (Harding) Conley. After graduating in 1955 from St. Edward High School in Lakewood, Ohio, Chuck received a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of South Carolina in 1959, majoring in mathematics. In 1964, Chuck received a Master of Science degree in Mathematics from Arizona State University. In 1970, Chuck received a Degree of Advanced Graduate Studies from Michigan State University, recognizing his successful completion of course work examinations required for a Ph.D. in Mathematical Statistics. Chuck served as an officer of the U.S. Navy from 1959-1962, reaching the rank of Lieutenant. Thereafter, Chuck served in the Navy Reserves, receiving an honorable discharge in 1972. Most of Chuck’s professional career was spent with the Michigan Family Independence Agency (formerly the Michigan Department of Social Services), first as a research statistician and then as director of the Survey and Analysis Division’s Offices of Quality Control. Through advanced statistical methods, Chuck helped the state of Michigan measure and improve the efficacy and efficiency of its social welfare programs – gaining recognition for Michigan’s Quality Control programs for their high standards and innovation. After retiring from the Michigan Family Independent Agency in 1997, Chuck became a private consultant, continuing to assist with the design and implementation of social services surveys for government contractors. Professionally, Chuck was affiliated with the American Statistical Association (serving as president of the Mid-Michigan Chapter, 1990-91) and American Society for Quality Control (through which he was certified as a Quality Control Engineer in 1987). Chuck is survived by his beloved wife of 50 years, Judy Ann Conley; his eight children: Carol (Maui, Hawaio); Thomas (Royal Oak, Michigan); Robert (Rochester, Michigan); Kathleen Bradley (Bend, Oregon); Elizabeth (Ferndale, Michigan); Charles (Alpharetta, Georgia); David (Atlanta, Georgia) and William (Santa Clara, California); his sister, Marianne Phelan (Mesa, Arizona); his brothers Michael (San Jose, California) and Patrick (Manassas, Virginia); and 14 grandchildren. Chuck and Judy raised each of their children in Lansing, Michigan, where they were longtime members of St. Gerard Catholic Church. Committed to civic engagement, Chuck was elected as Lansing Township Trustee for a term in 1998 and, throughout his life, was devoted to many

charitable causes – especially programs for youth, St. Vincent de Paul, and Habitat for Humanity. Funeral services will be conducted at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church, 960 Caymus St. Napa, CA 94559, at 10 a.m. on June 20, 2014.
