David Milner, 37, of Napa died on Wednesday, June 12, 2013. Raised in North Stonington, CT, David graduated from St. Bernard High School, Uncasville, CT, and received his BA from St. Anselm College, Manchester, NH in 1998. For the past 15 years, David fully enjoyed living in the Napa Valley. He was employed by Downtown Joe's, the Perfect Puree, State Farm Insurance and Napa Valley Limousine Services.
