Dr. Eleanor Hynote (DiMento) died December 17, 2013 in Napa at age 56. She was born in Brookline, MA to Francis and Rita DiMento on June 21, 1957.

Ellie graduated from Brookline High School, Vassar College and University of California Irvine, School of Medicine. She opened her internal medicine and clinical nutrition practice in Napa in 1989. Ellie devoted her professional life to the practice of medicine from which she received great gratification and was admired and respected by all of her colleagues and patients. She enjoyed snow skiing, travel, the beach at Nantasket and Martha's Vineyard and, most of all, her family.

Ellie is survived by her husband, Robert "Randy" A. Hynote of Napa, CA; daughters, Caroline J., Julia A. and Olivia A. Hynote all of Napa, CA; parents, Francis J. and Rita A. (Freda) DiMento of Brookline, MA; sister, Melissa Lang of Brighton, MA and Boca Raton, Florida; brothers, Vincent "Jim" J. DiMento and his wife Jane of Westwood, MA; Francis J. DiMento, Jr. and his wife Dale of West Roxbury, MA; and many nieces and nephews and caring relatives and friends.

“ We have lost our Ellie. A board certified internist, Vassar graduate with fellowships in clinical nutrition, botanical medicine... and the most marvelous smile and sparkle in her eyes. She loved to learn, embraced new ideas and deeply cared about others. The first time I met her she was so excited about my use of intravenous lipid therapy she wanted to try it right then and there in the middle of a medical conference. When I visited her clinic, Phoenix Well Care in Napa, California I was deeply touched by her kindness and dedication towards her patients. Ellie would often call me to ask for assistance with patients who had acute problems. She was not intimidated by a challenging diagnosis, nor am I, so away we would go blending evidence based medicine with nutritional biochemistry to create targeted intravenous and oral protocols. Ellie was brave and strong and true. She never gave up on anyone, she turned over every stone to find the answer, fought every battle. Ellie faced everything with grace and will always be a beacon of light for those who aspire to be everything an integrative physician should be.
