



## Mary P. Donohoe

June 8, 1934 - September 13, 2017

Mary P. Donohoe (Wilson) died peacefully in Napa, CA on September 13th. She was 83 years old.

Mary was born in Napa on June 8, 1934. She graduated from St. John's Catholic Church, Napa High School, and O'Connor School of Nursing in San Jose. Mary enjoyed a 40+ year career as an operating room nurse at Parks Victory and Queen of the Valley Hospitals in Napa.

She married R. Kevin Donohoe in September, 1959, and together they raised a family. Mary is survived by her husband R. Kevin Donohoe, children Thomas Donohoe (Aline) of Petaluma, Diane Williamson of San Diego, Margaret Donohue of San Diego, and a brother, Bruce Wilson of San Jose. Mary is also survived by numerous nieces and nephews, and four grandchildren. Mary was a member of the parish at St. Apollinaris Catholic Church for 56 years.
