



## Nelson "Skip" Hansen

Nelson L. (Skip) Hansen passed away on June 27, 2013, from complications brought on by Parkinson's disease. Skip was born in Shickly, Neb., on Feb. 22, 1931, to Rena and Nels Hansen.
