Robert P. Lye is at rest at the age of 86, after dealing with cancer. He was born Oct. 4, 1926, in Waterloo, Calif. He died at home on Jan. 26, 2013.

Bob was a proud veteran of the U.S. Navy; having served in World War II aboard the USS Alaska in the Pacific. When he returned to Dixon, Calif., after the war, he graduated from high school and then went on to Sacramento State University. He worked in the drywall business and had Midstate Drywall in Vallejo for 50 years.

He moved to Napa and was a member of Silverado Country Club for over 40 years. His passion was golf, and his son, Mark Lye, went on to become a PGA tour pro and Golf Channel analyst. John Larson Lye served in the Marine Corp and graduated from the Corcoran School in Arlington, Va. Daughter Diana has an art degree from Briarcliff and has a design business, Zarangoza, in San Anselmo, Calif.
